Then R/Ham 1 defeated Manjimup 2-1 we were assured of the Grand Final playoff (thanks to some great goalkeeping from Peter Molner).









Best of luck to those who received trophies. Hopefully, the other girls will pick up something next year.






"1C LADIES HOPPING RACE."
