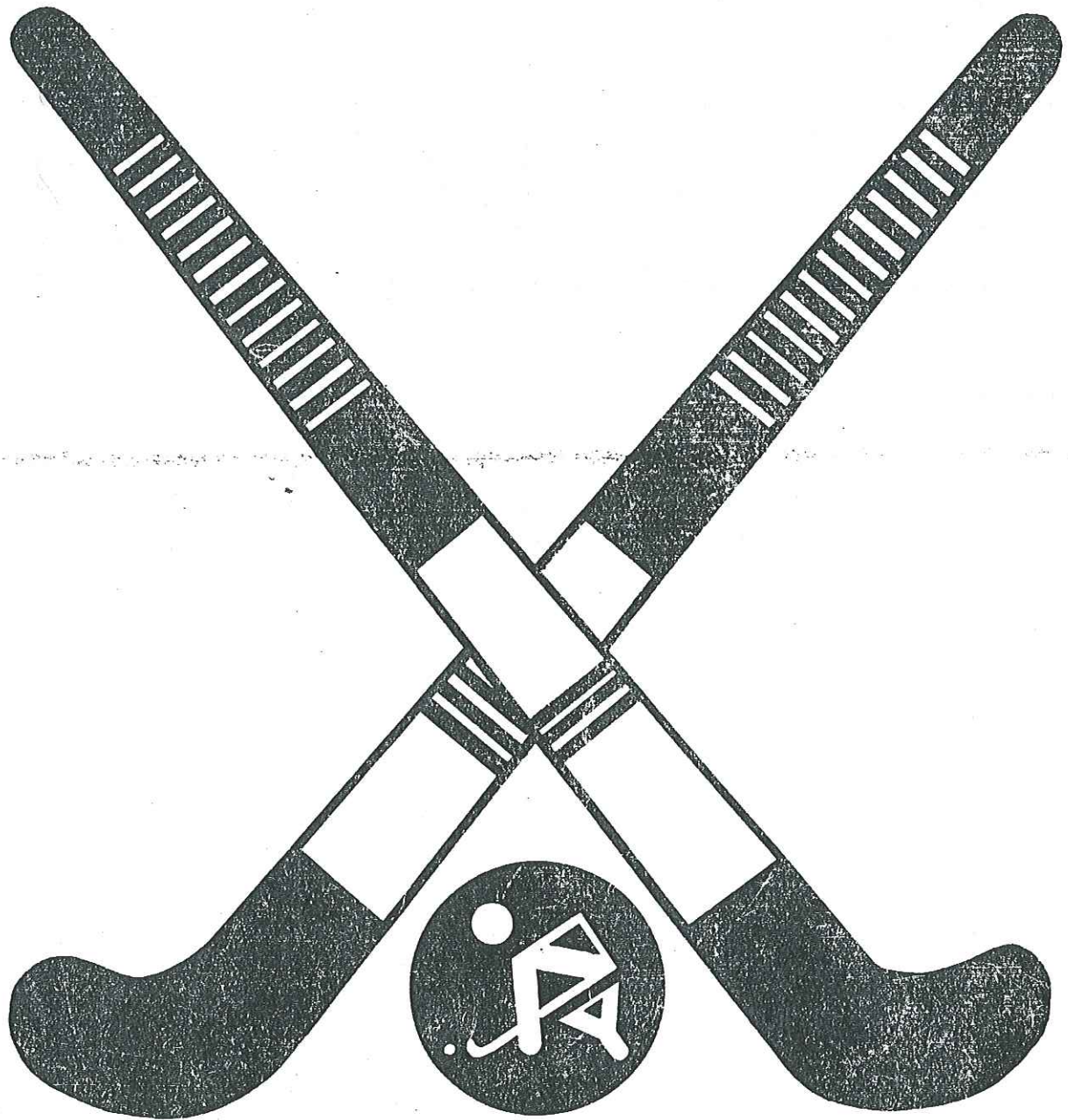



PRESIDENT'S REPORT

Yet another hard but successful season is all but over; and difficult it has been for your committee. Not only have they had the day to day running of the club but also two major tasks; that of incorporation of the club, and arranging the monies, etc to build those long-awaited club rooms.

Incorporation

By the time you get to read this, incorporation of the club should be completed. This means all future committees, although still fully answerable for their actions and decisions to the club members, cannot be sued as a whole or individually from any outside bodies.

Club Rooms

Receiving a phone call from Kim McDonald, I was told the Shire had placed an add in the local paper calling for applications for sporting and community grants. A job began. An application form was sort and duly filled in with the help of Dave Elliott, who had previously drawn up plans for the rooms. The Shire application also enlightened us to the fact that the Department for Sport and Recreation was also in the mood for handing out money. Both applications were successful; being \$4,230 and \$3,520 respectively.

This project is joint with the Rockingham Cricket Club, and each club having to raise approx \$2,625 for the remaining funds. To achieve this target, we kept W.A.H.A. fees at the same rate, although there had been a reduction. The extra went to the building fund. Also "Buy-A-Brick" was implemented: all are asked to make a donation and names will be placed on a plaque to hang forever in our clubrooms. Once the building is completed we then have the expensive job of fitting out the interior. And, hopefully, the rooms will be ready for the start of next season.

And the committee wasn't the only place it has been busy this year. With 5 mens and 3 womens teams our club has had more teams in the finals than some of the larger clubs, eg Wenley-South Perth. In achieving this I wish to thank all the players who made this a successful year. That includes those who played full season or only a few games - all efforts helped.

A special thanks to all the supporters who turned up week after week, offering encouragement and support: be it for your team or the next one playing; while having a few drinks after the games and analysing the day's efforts; or attending the social events.

Also, thus, to the social committee; thanks for the hard work - I think that all ages have been catered for through their efforts. A difficult task to get that balance but done well this year.

Then the coaches. A job fraught with dangers. Not easy, but very necessary. To you all, thanks from me and thanks from all the club. So to all those not included above, thank you for your effort, no matter how small.

Finally, I would like to thank you all for your support during the year and a special thanks to the committee who have been extremely helpful in this, my first year, as president.

LOOKING BACK

The Rockingham Ladies Hockey Club was formed in 1969, when Laurel Carter gathered a team together. The eventually expanded to three teams with the home ground at Shoalwater Oval. Players for that first match were Jean Ritchie (who broke a bone in her hand in the first game), Laurel Carter, Jan Smith, Jan's two daughter, Allison and Helen, (Helen being only 10 at the time was thought to be too small to be endangering the legs of the more senior ladies), Lynette Rosalie, and Marilyn Earnshaw made up the rest of the team.

Mr. George Earnshaw, father of the last three mentioned girls was coach and mentor and the team played the 'old rules' remembered by so few today; the roll-in from the side line, 25 line bully, and the centre bully.

Games were played on Sunday mornings and opposing teams came from as far south as Dwellingup and north to Kwinana. During those early years there were many social gatherings and scratch matches, where husbands played wives and when raffle prizes were exhausted a husband was raffled. Gordon (you know who), after umpiring many games at a carnival on Shoalwater Oval was won in a raffle by a very embarrassed Liz (then) Pollini at a following B.B.Q.

We had some notable locals coaching us in those days. ie. George Earnshaw, Dr. Bert England, and Mike Barnett. Later Dr. Bob Warner was that 'voice' from the sideline.

The mens Hockey Club was formed after an ad., in the local paper inserted by Lauri Doncon and Terry Tate, who were the instigators of their first team. The first meeting was well attended and a team was formed of Terry Tate, Lauri Doncon, Pat Adam, Ken Byfield, Bob Steel, Ron Chaplin, Rod Vernon, Marty Kapleman, ~~Derek Jones~~, Ray Lilig, and Joe Vas. They played in the Murray districts comp., against teams from Mandurah, Pinjarra, Harvey. Some primitive grounds in those days resulted in players dribbling the ball onto cow dung then hitting it as the opponent tackled. The resulting adornment of cow dung on the uniform at least distracted the flies from the B.B.Q. following the match.

In 1974 the men joined the W.A.H.A. and excelled in the ensuing years, winning the Cuth Ardath pennants and making Grand Final appearances on several occasions.

1978 saw the ladies and mens Clubs join forces and grow to more than 100 members. The men were finally after some years, granted a home ground on the Rockingham Oval.

The ladies played in the Murray districts Assn., until the Coastal District Assn. was formed. Then in 1980 a team of dedicated players went to the Metro to try their skills and succeeded in bringing home Premierships in the following three years. A grand effort. Tim Pyne was a fine coach and a great asset to the Club. A shame to loose him to Gosnells.

In recent years the club has fielded teams for many ages; U/13 boys, U/15 boys, U/16 girls, U/19 young men, three senior ladies teams and thre to fur senior mens teams.

In 1986 three premierships were won by the U/19, U/17 boys and the Reserve Green men side. This was our finest hour.

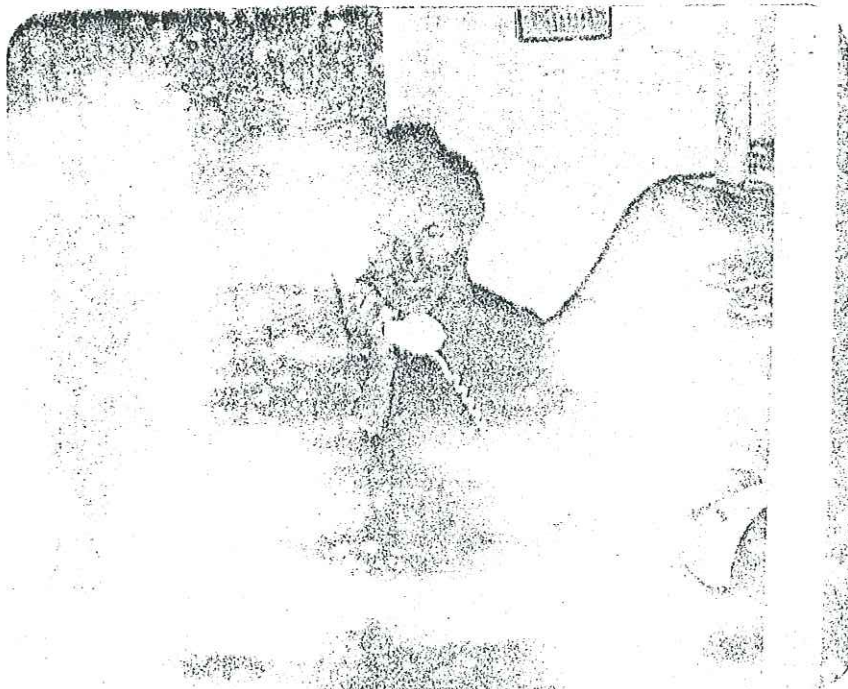

The future hopes of the Club include more spacious and modern clubrooms and the plans are with the Shire.

The U/17's came up on the Saturday, and since only one room had been booked for them, 8 to 10 people slept in the one room!!

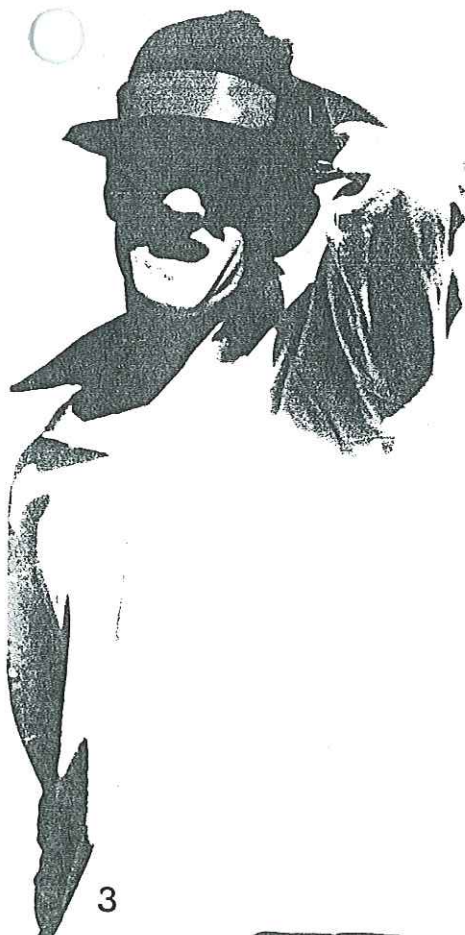

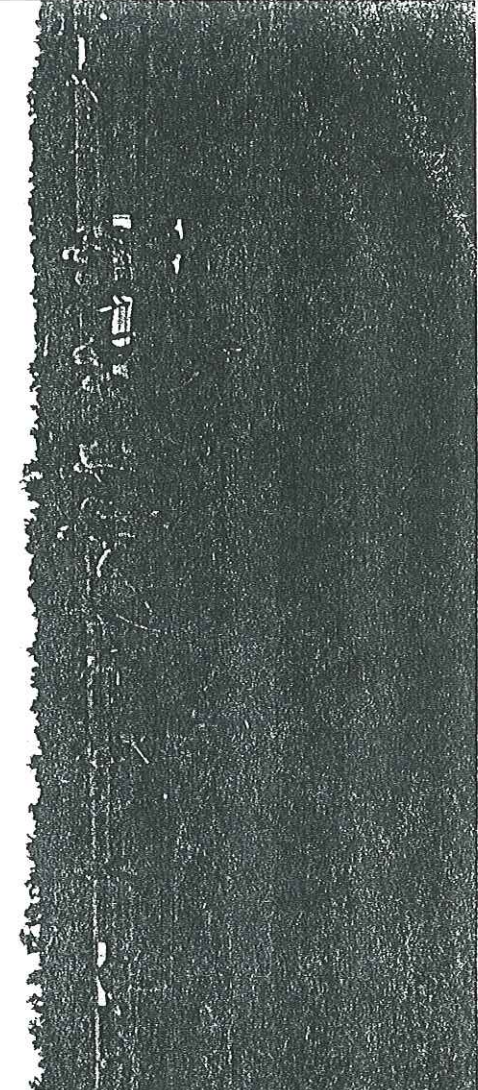


1. This isn't what it looks like.

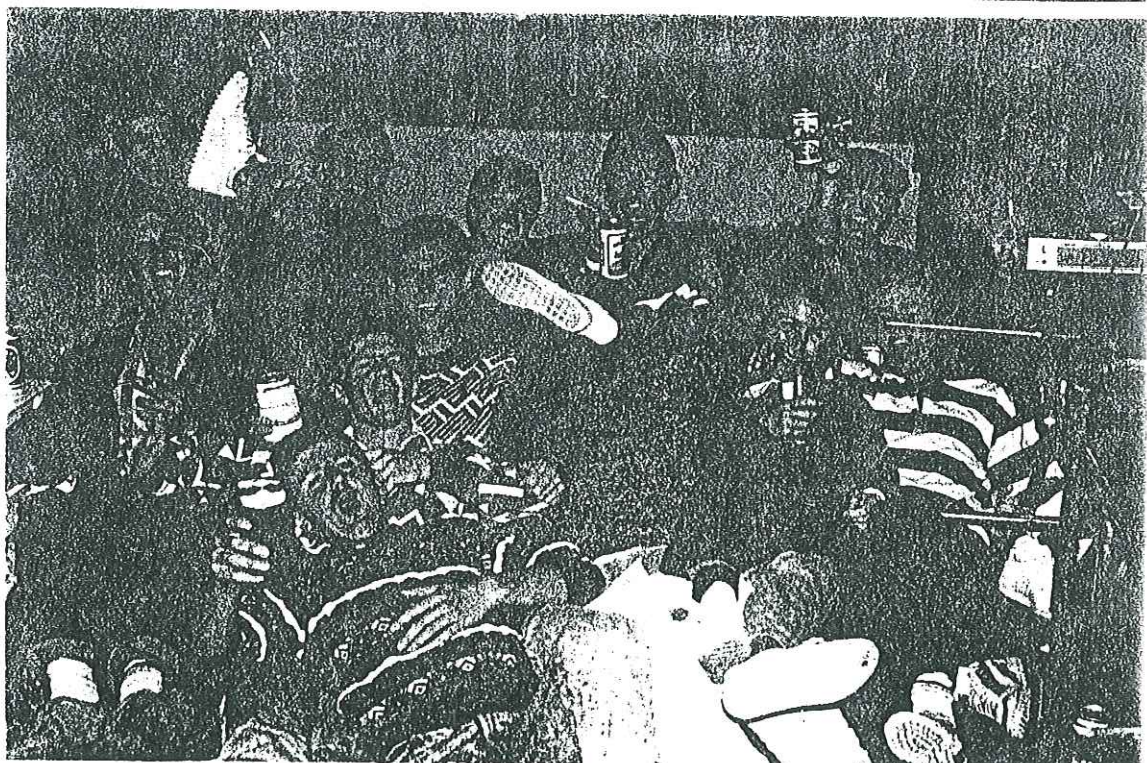
