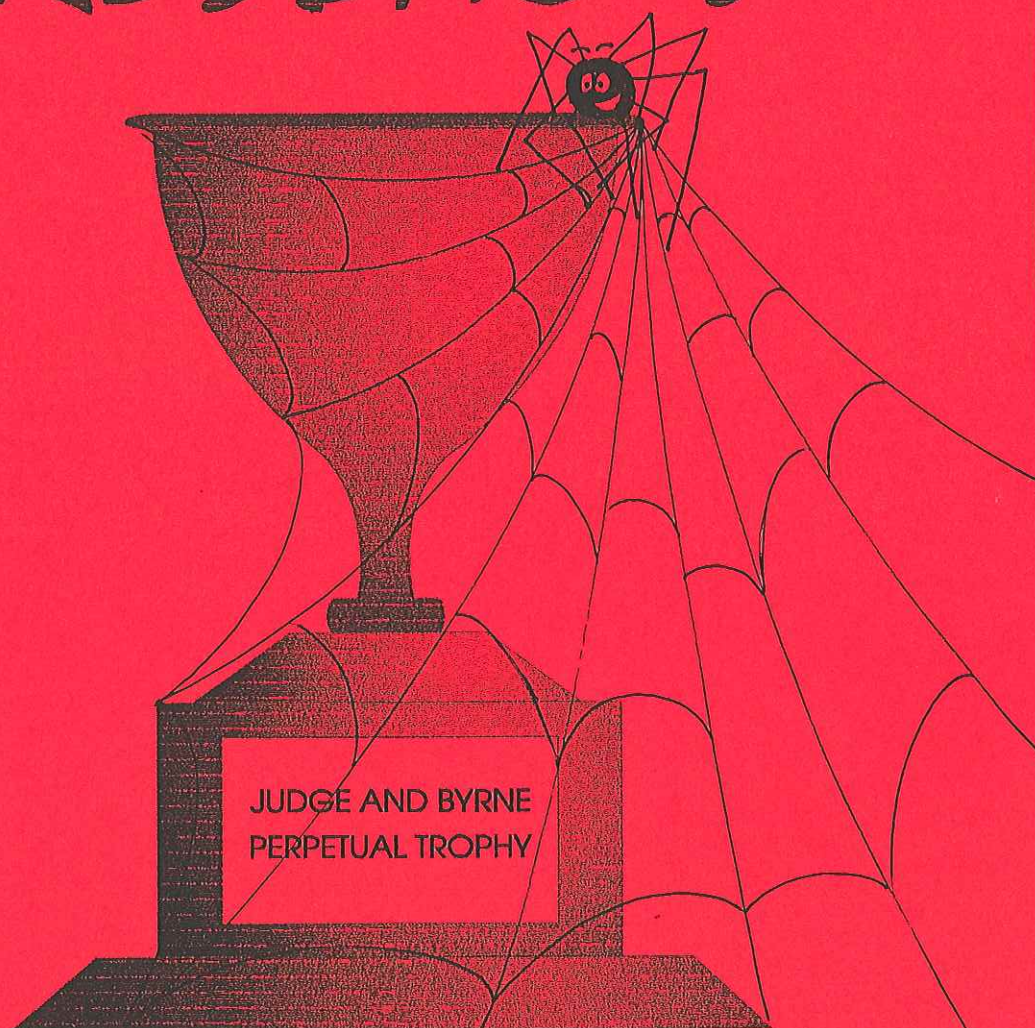
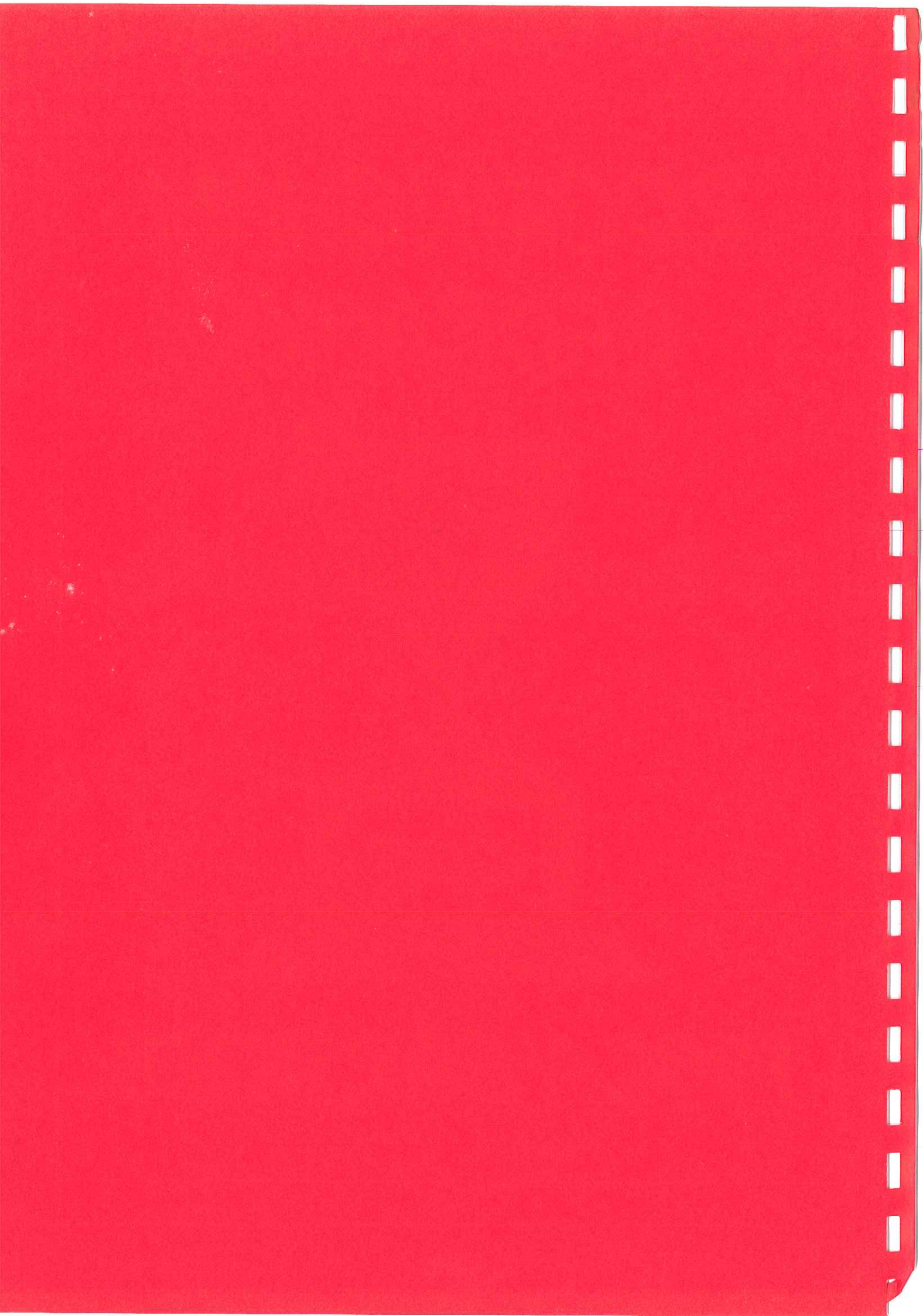

Treasurer's Report - Season 1995

We have finished the season with a net balance of \$2,611.39, after known expenses were taken from the bank reconciliation statement. With the installation of our flood-lights and a turnover of over \$40,000, we are now truly locked into a large club facility, where financial records, monthly club procedures and budgets must be met at the start of, and during, each season. We are no longer a club where a "she'll be right" attitude can exist.

I welcome the new nominee for treasurer; a person more than capable of keeping in place the necessary financial procedures. Because of our nominated auditor's work commitments, our books at this stage have not yet been audited, but they must be prior to the start of next season.

We must purchase a new bar cash register in order to keep control of our main cash-handling facility. Otherwise I believe the procedures in place at present are good.

The bar facility netted us \$4,158.00 profit since last year's AGM, thus paying a great deal of our expenses. However the bar facility is being supported by less than half our members. On figures given to the committee at our last meeting, actual costs projected into next year - each lady costing the club \$189.00 and men \$279.00 each. Match this with our 1995 fees of ladies - \$60.00 (\$75.00) and men - \$110.00 (\$140.00) and you can see the benefit the bar has in absorbing a large percentage of annual costs. My recommendation for the incoming committee to consider would be to reduce actual fees for members who support our voucher system, and increase fees for those who do not. Also, I intend to recommend a discounted fee system for those members who pay their fees before or on the due date, and penalties for those that do not.

We must make a provision each year for light maintenance and also a provision of at least \$2000.00 to pay off the principle loan in four years time.

1C TEAM REPORT

1995

For a team that is **A:** Not Fit enough.

B: Not committed enough.

C: Not serious enough.

We continue to perform remarkably well.

At the beginning of the year we decided that, as a team, we needed to become more attacking. We reverted back to a five man forward line and decided to play our fullbacks high. This for the most part proved to be very successful.

We were beaten by only two teams, Old Guildford (eventual Guth Ardagh Winners) and Kalamunda (we played with only eight men on the field and a very cosy back of the goal area, an unusual tactic that didn't prove very rewarding) and eventually finished second on the ladder.

We scored a total of 57 goals, a record by us in this grade, conceding only 28. We had some terrific matches twice beating team in the top half of the ladder by huge 10-2 and 7-1 margins. Our on field success was matched by a equally impressive maturity both on and off the field. With the exception of the game against Kalamunda send offs and questioning of decisions were virtually zero and by far the best in the competition.

As a result of our success promotion to 1b's is now available, and with the second's also advancing should prove to be a formidable challenge. Whether the club will, or indeed can respond to such a challenge is an interesting point.

I am firmly of the belief that we can no longer simply close up shop at the end of 95 and expect everything to be fine in 1996. That may have been the case when our ultimate quest was securing a pennant in RESERVE GREEN'S but not today. The current standing's of our top two sides can and will have an effect on the immediate future of our club as a whole. Whereas the successes we have enjoyed in recent years can bring in new players, conversely a thumping next year could have a huge impact on our very limited supply of talented players.

We have, in recent years, been extremely lucky to hang on to three players, Scot Walker, Greg Halden and Bryan Taylor who, I firmly believe, could easily have played at Classic League level. Coaching a side with a core of players such as this is a privilege few enjoy. We also have excellent backup in the likes of Brad Ball, Ewan Gunn and Dave Elliott and with players like Ross Walker, an average player last year repaying my faith in him with above average performance on the field this year, things you might think are looking pretty bright.

Well, they are and they are not. The only way we can reap the rewards of some tremendously talented young players such as 95 1c's Clint Mills and Craig Nugent and up and comers for the 17's in Clint Chase, Bronson Pereira, Jake Mitchell, Damien Malone and Mark Coppendale is for the senior members to help in the transition. I therefore genuinely appeal to those senior members of the squad this year to give us one more year next year.

I feel as though I have given a great deal to this club in recent years and have been richly rewarded for it. Very few in the club are fully aware of the cost those in the firsts incur not only in terms of time but also physically and financially. It is vital we retain those irreplaceable few who have already indicated they are unable or unwilling to continue next year. To them I unfairly ask they reconsider and commit themselves once more. If they do the club will be in a position to continue to grow. Without them 96 will be a very difficult and turbulent year indeed.

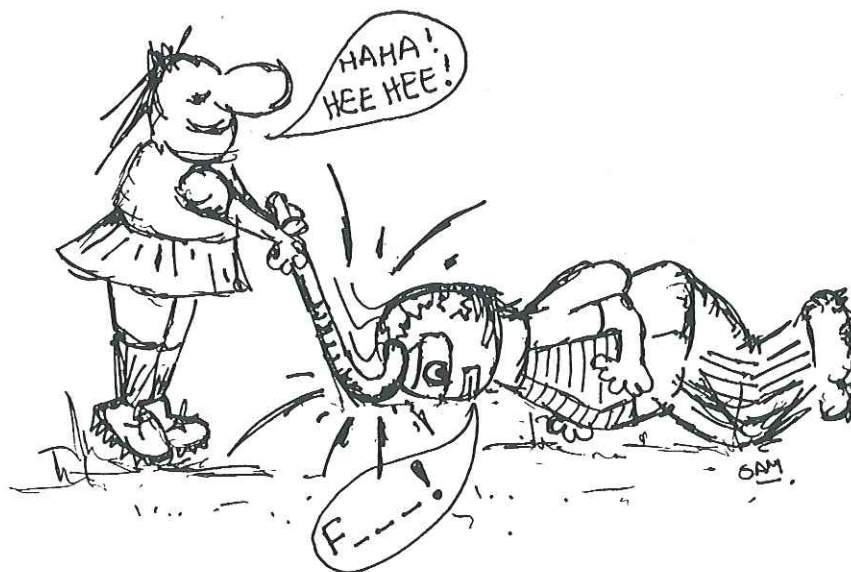
