I'll now start again with the true story!



All the best for Xmas and New Year, and for a great hockey season in 1997.



Congratulations to the 1B's and 2B's for holding their own in very tough grades - it gives our club another year to build on our success of 1995.

It was a tough year both on and off the field, and as president I would like to thank the executive committee, social committee, coaches, captains and managers for their efforts in keeping our club on track in becoming one of the best.

As club members looking to our club's future, we should all thank Rhonda, Wendy, Clint and all those members that helped out this year with the Peel Association Juniors. This year saw a large increase in members of both Minkey and other grades. After speaking with the Peel Junior officials, 1997 may see the Juniors playing their season at the Stan Twight reserve, which would mean a big boost for hockey within the area, not to mention our club. Junior hockey would be played on the best field in Rockingham, but it would mean a necessity for large participation of our club's top players to help the Peel committee take their coaching a step further. For the many that helped in 1996, thank you and please continue the good work next year.

Financially, our club did not do as well as we expected and hoped, due mainly to the lack of support by the majority of our members. Because of this, it is possible that 1997 will probably be subject to a hike in fees, unless the committee can come up with another solution.

One thing I have to express: unless we as members want our club to become like others, where members don't know many others, rarely see members of other club teams and don't support other teams or support their club after games or on function nights, our club's fees will rise - they have to. how many functions did you attend and how often did you stay on after games in 1996? As members, it's up to you. Please remember that it is your club, and hopefully it will be here for your children - bigger and better.

Treasurer's Report - Season 1995-1996

We have finished the season with a net balance of \$4,257.55, after known expenses were taken from the Bank Reconciliation Statement. This amount includes the \$2,500.00 provision for light maintenance and to pay out the Light Loan in 4 years, which was a recommendation from Alan Mills for us to do each year. So in actual fact, we have \$1,757.55, which is not enough for our \$2,500.00 provision for the 1995-96 season.

A recommendation last year for a new Cash Register to be purchased has not yet been done, mainly due to lack of funds. This needs to be purchased for next season though, as we need to be able to have more control over our bar sales.

New shirts need to be purchased for next year, which we estimate at around the \$3,000.00 mark. I'm not sure where these funds will come from. If we were to use our light provision money, the new committee would need to ensure that this money is fully recouped and kept aside again.

While the bar made a profit of \$5,066.11 this season, it is still not enough. You will also notice in my report that Total Income was \$33,573.27 and Total Expenditure was \$34,522.41, leaving a shortfall of \$949.14, we cannot run like this forever. As all members are not supporting our social function, I see our only solution is to raise the fees. Maybe we do not give members an option on whether they purchase the voucher system. Make everyone pay the same, if you use your vouchers, great, if not, bad luck, that is your levy to the club.

Due to work commitments of our Auditor, books have not yet been done. I suggest a change to the Constitution that the books will be audited prior to the start of the following season.




