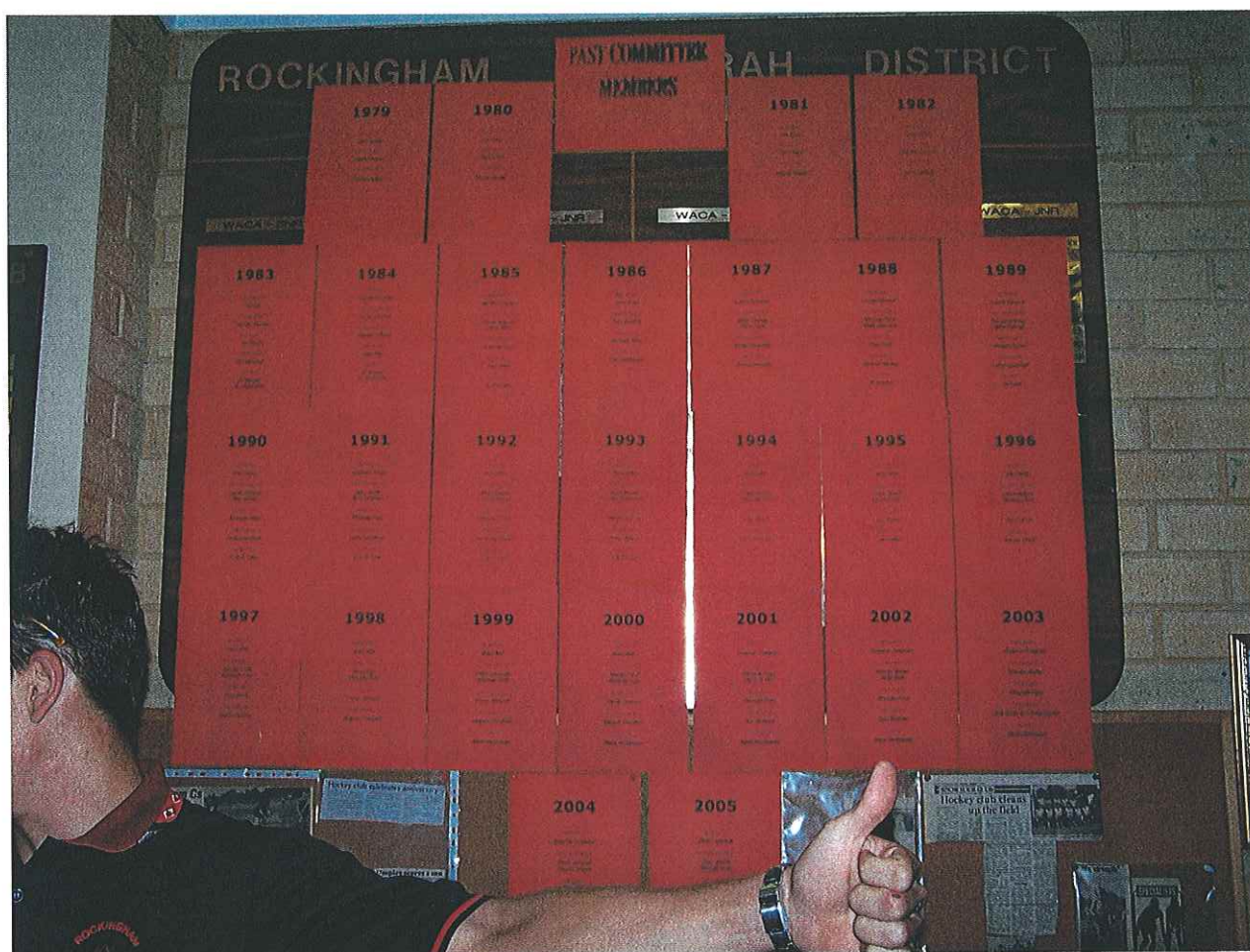
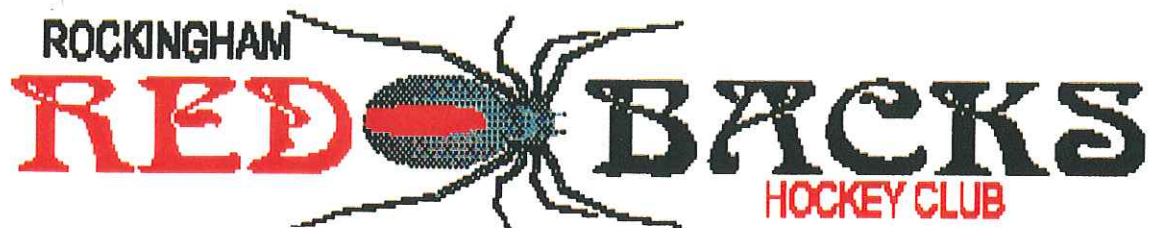

HISTORY OF THE ROCKINGHAM DISTRICTS HOCKEY CLUB

FORWARD

The contents of this document have been compiled with the assistance of many past and some present Rockingham Districts Hockey Club members. I have endeavored to research the origins of the women and men's club prior to amalgamation in 1978.

I have been considering writing this document for many years, as I believe the heritage of this fine club needs to be preserved for the benefit of the future of hockey in the Rockingham District. Current as well as past members have supplied much needed information to make this document as precise as possible and for those of you who have contributed, I thank you.

Sifting through the information brought back a flood of memories and made me realise just how many people I have had the privilege of meeting and sharing the love of hockey with through my 28 year association with this club. I firmly believe that if the amalgamation of the men and women's club in 1978 had not eventuated, there would not be a hockey club in Rockingham today.

It would be remiss of me not to mention that the amalgamation between our club and the Navy (Fleet Base West) has brought constant talent and resources to this club over the years that has served to make the club stronger each year.

ROCKINGHAM LADIES HOCKEY CLUB 1969 – 1978

AS TOLD BY PAM FORD (1986 yearbook) reproduced in part

I joined this club in 1970 or thereabouts. In those days it was just a ladies club playing hockey on Sunday mornings from as far away as Dwellingup to Kwinana. We had a lot of fun times with barbecues after matches on the Shoalwater oval.

When we ran out of cakes to auction we raffled off the younger members, my husband winning little, very embarrassed, Liz Polini. Along with the good times we had the usual trouble with who was going to play in what team and who was going to umpire.

My husband, Gordon, got this doubtful job most Sundays and consequently the Sunday lunch table was a battle ground of 'wrong decision'. My memory fails me but it may have been around 1975 when the men joined forces, bringing with them many new members and many new debts. High hurdles were overcome and we gained in strength in many ways. We were no longer dismissed by our local shire as a minor sporting body. We grew rapidly in the next few years, but alas, lost a few girls over the next season or so as they became mums and the men became work bound, or age caught up with us.

Although we began the season a little shaky, we are now looking forward to all sorts of good things such as joining with the cricket club (within the next three years) and eventually having grounds with a club room with function rooms and canteen/bar and all the amenities to call our "home of Rocky Hockey".

LOOKING BACK (1987 yearbook, author unknown)

The Rockingham Ladies hockey club was formed in 1969, when Laurel Carter gathered a team together. The club eventually expanded to three teams with the home ground at Shoalwater Oval. Players for that first match were, Jean Ritchie (who broke a bone in her hand in the first game), Laurel Carter, Jan Smith, Jan's two daughters, Allison and Helen, (Helen being only 10 at the time was thought to be too small to be endangering the legs of the more senior ladies), Lynette, Rosalie and Marilyn Earnshaw made up the rest of the team.

Mr George Earnshaw, father of the last three mentioned girls was coach and mentor and the team played the 'old rules' remembered by so few today, the roll in from the sideline, 25 line bully, and the centre bully.

Games were played on Sunday mornings and opposing teams came from as far south as Dwellingup and North to Kwinana. During those early years there were many social gatherings and scratch matches, where husbands played wives and when raffle prizes were exhausted, a husband was raffled. Gordon, (you know who) after umpiring many games at a carnival on Shoalwater oval, was won in the raffle by a very embarrassed Liz (then) Pollini at a following barbecue.

We had some notable locals coaching us in those days, i.e. George Earnshaw, Dr. Bert England and Mike Barnett. Later Dr. Bob Warner was that 'voice' from the sideline.

The men's hockey club was formed in 1972 after an advertisement in the local paper inserted by Laurie Doncon and Terry Tate, who were the instigators of their first team. The first meeting was well attended and a team was formed of, Terry Tate, Laurie Doncon, Pat Adlam, Ken Byfield, Bob Steer, Ron Chaplin, Rod Vernon, Marty Cappleman, Derek Jones, Ray Lillig, Joe Vasilauskis.

They played in the Murray Districts competition against teams from, Mandurah, Pinjarra and Harvey. Some primitive grounds in those days resulted in players dribbling the ball into cow dung then hitting it as the opponent tackled. The resulting adornment of cow dung on the uniform at least distracted the flies from the barbecue following the match.

In 1974 the men joined W.A.H.A. and excelled into the ensuing years, winning the Guth Ardarth pennants and making grand final appearances on several occasions.

1979 saw the ladies and men's clubs join forces and grow to more than 100 members. The club was finally after some years granted a home ground on Rockingham Oval.

The ladies played in the Murray Districts Association until the Coastal Districts Association was formed. Then in 1980, a team of dedicated players, coached by Tim Pyne, went to the metro to try their skills and succeeded in bringing home premierships in the following three years. A grand effort.

Tim Pyne was a fine coach and a great asset to the club.

THE AMALGAMATION OF THE ROCKINGHAM LADIES AND MENS HOCKEY CLUBS 1979

As remembered by Trena and Peter Janczyk??

Prior to amalgamation I was a member of the Mens club from about 1973. Trena had been a member of the ladies club since approx 1974.

Both clubs had been endeavouring to promote hockey in the Rockingham District and provide facilities and competitions for hockey players. It was realised by both clubs that resources needed to be joined and that one Rockingham club needed to be formed to better achieve those goals. It was inevitable that an amalgamation had to take place.

The Rockingham District Hockey Club was formed and our first home ground was at Bungaree Oval, then Anniversary Park, Rockingham Oval and then Stan Twight Reserve.

In 1979 it was decided that each team had to supply one member on the inaugural social committee. The social committee formed with both Trena and myself representing our teams and our friendship turned to romance and then finally marriage. Hows that for commitment! And yes we produced a hockey baby in Megan.

In the early 1980's the club was purely metropolitan based and had several Mens and ladies teams achieving some outstanding results in what was known as the WAHA competition. Those results can be seen as pennants displayed at the club rooms.

Due to work commitments I resigned as Vice President in April 1988 and Trena and I moved to Merredin, Pingelly and Karratha finally returning to the Rockingham Club in 1997. From 1988 to 1996 Trena and I came back every year and played several games for Rockingham and enjoyed the infamous Bunbury Hockey Carnivals.

A little known award around the club is the Sid Czabotar "wet blanket" award. This award was usually presented after the Bunbury Carnival to the recipient who was voted as being either a wet blanket (eg; not staying up all night playing cards) or committed some other notorious act. There are some well known names engraved on that award!

I could go on for ages telling stories but in closing can I say that due to the hard work by Executive Committee Members, Social Committee members, coaches, players and partners the club has continued to progress.

I envisage that the move to the new Lark Hill facility will not only give us a first class turf, grounds and clubroom, but will encourage new and past members to join the club. The current and future committee members and players will need to give a commitment to the club so that the club continues to grow.

We went from playing on cow paddocks, to Pat Goodrich Centre, to Astro turf in a short number of years. We won 1 premiership against arch nemesis, Wanneroo, that I can remember.

I vaguely remember Rhonda lap dancing at the Rockingham Hotel after that Grand Final win.

We played metro hockey for 6 years, till we all started to have babies. We then returned to play in the Murray Districts and Coastal Districts competitions, one team in each.

Eventually the two competitions amalgamated to become Peel, and I have been playing ever since. Our 1st team struggled for a couple of years after our return, as we were all still reproducing. We have played in most final series since then, but were usually always the bridesmaids.

I remember many a Karaoke night at the clubrooms, with Lorna Shirra and Maureen Coles fighting each other for the microphone. Neither could sing a note, but we didn't care. The more you drank, the better they sounded.

I remember very well, dancing on the bar at the clubrooms, much to then President, Alan Mills' disgust. He didn't seem to think that the bar was going to hold under all that weight. Bit rude of him I thought.

One particular bus trip to 'nowhere' springs to mind, Greg Thompson's first year with us. I ended up with my lace knickers ripped to shreds after he gave me a 'wedgy'. I had to explain that one when I got home.

My hockey history from 1986 to 1995 is a bit sketchy. I think having those babies killed off a few brain cells and my memory is shot.

'A' Grade ladies won grand finals in 1996 under the guidance of Bryan Taylor and again in 2001.

'A Reserve' ladies won in 1995, 2001 and 2002 and 'B' grade won in 2003.

A highlight for Rhonda and all of her family, was obviously the running of the 'Olympic Torch Relay' in 2000.

The last couple of years have seen our Club thrive with young juniors. It is very satisfying to see the fruits of our labour becoming such an integral part of our Club. The next couple of years should be very exciting for our Club, with new turf and the ages of our players.

Finally, my most precious moment would have to be at last years Presentation/Wind-up Night, when I was awarded Life Membership of this very special and unique club.
