





Throughout Season 2007 I was very impressed with the commitment and energy I saw around the club from games, meetings and at club functions.

To the inaugural interim Board members, Senior and Junior Committees, Coaches, Team Managers/Captains, Umpires, Canteen helpers, Webmaster and anyone else I may have missed, a very big thank for your efforts from me personally and on behalf of all club members.

The incoming 2008 Board and committees will need to continue to develop a communications strategy so that all role positions and club members are better informed of events including

the social scene in a timelier manner, as well as the roles and responsibilities of the functioning bodies of the club.

There is still much work to do in preparation for Season 2008 and the move to Larkhill Sportsplex. The clubrooms are expected to be completed mid December 2007 followed by the turf in February/March 2008. The incoming Board and Committees will be working throughout the off Season and will be facing some hard decisions in preparation to the move to Larkhill as well as the future of the club.

The Board will continue to liaise with Rockingham City Council in regards to finalising the facility management/lease agreement, Hockey WA in regards to fixturing and technical support, Rockingham Softball Club regarding joint management of the facility as well as the fit out of the clubrooms and Peel Hockey Board to ascertain ways where the two turfs may support each other as well as examining the role Peel Hockey competition has to play in the future vision of our Club.

The Board will be working hard towards developing a 3-5 year strategic business plan to secure the future of this great club and will be calling for input from club members during that process.

A big push for next year will be towards the development of Coaches. The incoming Board will be considering a Coaching plan that will see coaches developed at all levels within the club to ensure they are qualified to a standard coaching level suitable for all teams and coaching methods are consistent.

I firmly believe that to attract and retain players at all levels a club needs to be able to offer top quality coaching at all levels. The initial financial outlay to adopt a coaching plan of this type is minimal compared to the potential benefits to the club over a period of time.

Season 2007 saw the introduction of a new playing strip throughout the club as part of the planned move to the new facility. This will be exciting time for all members and will form a unique part in the history of the Rockingham District Hockey Club as it continues to grow.

For the past three years I have always encouraged younger members of the club to become involved in taking on roles and responsibilities within the club to gain a better understanding of club functions. I am very pleased in the support shown by a lot of young members by taking on coaching roles at senior and junior levels, Umpire Director role and strong support at club functions.

For Season 2008 I encourage parents of juniors to play an active role in the running of the junior section of the club. Whether that is as part of the Junior Committee, coaching, team managing or playing a role in organising and attending junior competitions such as Busselton. Any assistance would be greatly appreciated by members who have carried out those roles over many years.

Finally, congratulations to John Wright and the First men's team in making it to the finals for the first time at that grade. A great effort and a great game saw the boys knocked out of the finals but they will be a force to be reckoned with next season.

At the time of writing this report the men's Second team, captained and coached by Dave Klinck lost the first play off in strokes but have a second bite for the finals the following weekend and I wish them the best of luck.

Unfortunately Division 2 Ladies bowed out of the finals but Division 3 made it through to the grand final, a great effort. 

Finally, all clubs need good leaders and good committee members, this year's Board has been superb in its support and help for me as I go and seek out sponsorship.




LIFE MEMBERSHIP NOMINATION Graeme CREEDON

Started the year playing in defence, then moved up into the midfield by the end of the year. Always performed strongly



Jasmine; one of our quieter young members who has also had a good season, hope to see you next year Jasmine.


Vanessa; has improved out of sight this year and does whatever is asked of her be it forward or back, hope to see you again next year too Vanessa.





Our Best Season so Far.


As you will all know this season has been a successful one for the boys.



Girls U/11




