


### President's Report

The club reach another milestone this year becoming a full year club where we hosted our first summer season competition for club members. This was an outstanding success and would not have been possible without the efforts of the first summer committee. I am looking forward to this year's competition as are all club members.

At the beginning of the winter season, we hosted the Japanese Women's Tenri University side who played against our Ladies side. This was a spectacular event and the Ladies gained much from the experience. The Redbacks Ladies 1's this year represented the club in Willow Bridge League. This is the highest level of hockey that our Ladies have played at in the clubs history, and although we did not win many games, we showed that we are capable of playing at this level. This was a big step towards fulfilling one of the long term goals and objectives in the clubs strategic plan. The board is very proud of the Ladies as they have risen to the challenge and represented the club well, and they should be proud of themselves too. The Ladies 2s have also had a very successful year and played finals, while the Ladies 3s have had a solid, enjoyable year.

I have seen many teams playing this year and I would like to commend all teams on their professionalism. I would like to specially mention the U13 and U15 boys and girls for the way they have represented the club. When I was at the Bunbury carnival a state selector made specific reference to me about the professionalism of our U15 boys which was also reflected towards all of our junior teams. This year, we had a number of junior members make talent squad and regional sides in U17's, U15s and we expect our U13's to also do well. The Regional U15 boys were well represented by Rockingham and the South Metro team went on to win the competition. The U15 girls had 2 players from Rockingham and was coached by Matt East and managed by Brenda Woods. This team also went on to win the competition. This recognition reflects positively on the club's direction of coaching and development of our young players.

The Men's feams have done well this year with an extra team being added to the metro competition. This meant that ours Men's 4s was nominated into a higher grade and they have done well as they are playing in the finals.

With regards to our strategic plan and the long term goals and objectives, there has been significant progress. Having teams playing at the highest competition grades for Men's, Ladies and Junior teams was one of our main objectives. We have this year had U13s play in A grade, Ladies move to Willow Bridge League and with Michael Nobbs coming on board as our senior coach; the Men's 1s are clearly focused on the long term goal of promotion to AHG competition. Next year there are clear opportunities for our U17, U15 and U13 boys all to be playing A Grade. The girls also have the opportunity to play A Grade in U13s and U15s.

With regards to becoming financially secure through active membership and local sponsorship, the board has had to tackle a number of significant issues this year. Some of these included registering for GST and the economic down turn. A new model was put in place for fee's which worked well, and the GST made no impact on the cost of fees, which were kept unchanged. We also managed our budget and expenditure closely to ensure that the economic down turn did not affect us. I can report that the clubs financial position is very strong.

With regards to developing a sustainable local competition — we have not done as well as what we would have liked. Although the junior committee worked tirelessly, this was not reflected in the numbers required. The board has already taken action in engaging Jamie Dodd to conduct a research project and provide options for a sustainable recruitment program. This will be a focus over the summer season.

This year we have seen the benefits of our coaching strategy with a number of U17 players coaching local competition and at Bunbury Carnival. We have also seen one of our coaches coach a regional side with great success and all of our junior metro coaches have had successful seasons. Junior umpiring development has been very successful with a number of younger members training as umpires throughout the year through our green shirt program. I have personally seen the results of this program having been given the opportunity to learn along side the junior members.

A focus for the incoming board needs to be on junior recruitment, and putting in place a paid position to assist the facilities director in running the day to day operations of the club. This is necessary as the work load has become too great, and we need to support the continued growth of the club.

I would like to thank Mark McGowan for being our Club Paton for the 10<sup>th</sup> year in a row. This is highly appreciated.

To our sponsors, it's been a tough year with the economic down turn and we appreciate your loyalty and support through this period. We look forward to a continuing long and prosperous relationship.

To the board, this has been a big year which has presented its challenges and rewards. I'd like to thank you personally and on behalf of all club members for your dedication, passion and commitment to making our club what it is.


I would also like to thank each of the committees, coaches, managers, umpires and all those that assisted in some way throughout the season. Without your support we would not have a successful club.
















### Facilities Report

On behalf of the social committee I would personally like to thank Manny for his support and guidance.


I would also like to thank the managers of each team for promoting every function.

### Coaching Director's Report

Introduction

The coaching objectives for the strategic plan are essentially to provide the best coaches available for all players at all stages of their development.

To this end, this season we have seen some successes, some encouraging work in progresses and some areas we need to develop.

Successes

2 years ago we introduced a policy for Metro Junior Hockey, where we identified talented coaches and matched them up with Metro teams, not for a single season but for a number of years. This has already shown clear benefits.

Derry Smith last season's coach of the year, helped his 13 boys into A grade, for the first time in the history of the club. Donna McKeown, has an all conquering, grand finalist group of 15 boys, that she will hopefully take to A grade at 17's next year. Finally Matt East, still a youngster himself, has led a talented group of 15 girls to successive finals action and was coach of the winning regional 15's side. We hope this success will continue with Alan Sadler's 13 Girls, who are not only in the league for the first time ever, but are in the Grand final too. Well done to all.

At local level, it has been great to see so many young players step up to coach for the first time, not forgetting of course the wily experience of a number of more senior local coaches, passing on their acquired knowledge.

At senior level we are fortunate to have not 1 ex-Olympian, but 2, coaching our elite sides. Michael Nobbs and Edny Vanden Broek have added considerable depth to our coaching knowledge and we hope to leverage this in years to come. Greg and Lee have combined well to organise the lower men's sides and I know that Dave Klinck has put in a sterling performance, with the Ladies 3's and taking over the Boys 17's when Cam McDonald decided to become a soldier.

Work in Progress

Too few of our coaches hold any relevant coaching qualifications and those that do may need refreshing. We can now assess our coaches within the club and have attempted to run some in season courses which has proved difficult with the considerable time commitments that we all have. Therefore, for 2010 there will be a number of courses run off season, with the intention to have all coaches qualified midway through 2010.

Development Areas

At senior level we need to confirm our coaches far earlier in the pre-season and we need more people, particularly from the ladies to put their hand up to coach.

There has been a lot of positive comment concerning the Minkey and Grad training programme introduced last year and it is clear from feedback that we should introduce a similar programme for the older juniors. To this end we shall be busy over the summer trying to develop a coaching manual that all coaches can use at each stage of the player pathway.

We have also been less than successful at leveraging the skills of our men's and ladies first team players when coaching the juniors and lower sides, and I hope this is something we can develop for the coming season.

Finally, a big thank you to everybody who has helped out this year, whether as a coach, or parent helper, the club grows stronger because of your investment.



Other Highlights



### Under 13 Boys



#### 7/8 A Grade

The 2009 season started with the U13 Metro boys being promoted from A Reserves to A Grade division in the competition. This was always going to be a challenge for the team as not many had played in the metro competition before let alone A Grade.

Our first game was a baptism of fire, meeting Wolves the premiers from the previous year and still with the same team, we lost 10 nil. Players got shuffled around and a basic idea of what was required had begun to develop.

In the next two rounds we steadily improved as players became more familiar with the level of the game and their positions. We were still on the receiving end from the opposition but nowhere near that of the first game. We were becoming more competitive, even training had moved into another gear.

Round 4, our first home game, we welcomed Melville, a long term A Grade side. With players settled into their positions, the game was off to a cracking start, our boys had jelled, with short sharp passing, we had quite a few attempts to score goals except Melville's goalkeeper had other ideas, early in the second half the incessant pressure became too much and we scored our first goal for the season. The score remained the same until near the end of the game when Melville got a short corner and converted with 39 seconds left on the clock. This was heartbreaking for the coach because the boys really deserved to win.

The Bunbury Hockey Carnival weekend fitted in between rounds 4 and 5. Jack Durrant - has developed well this year and loves hockey, although he has had to compete with a significant growth spurt which always impacts on co-ordination.


Jordan Klopper - has really come a long way in skills and running, towards the end of the season showed some classy skills during the game.


Mid season, the girls set themselves some realistic and some optimistic goals for the remainder of the season. These were:

- 2. Secondly the girls. They are an excellent group of ambassadors for our club. They play hard and they play fair. I was lucky this year, having a player base






The under 17 girls had a successful year despite many difficulties with numbers each week due to a lack of registrations and injuries.


We started the year well by winning the B Division State Champs, going on to make the finals, only to be knocked out in the first semi.




Ryan Hentschke our inside forward had a solid year but was most pleasing was his desire to continue to learn and strive to be the best he could. A pleasure to coach this year


## Club Person Award
