

Although we missed the promotion games, the side has dominated games without getting the wins which has been extremely frustrating and the teams downfall.


On a positive side there has been impressive performances from our experienced players, our imports and from the clubs younger players.


The Redbacks will be a force once again in 2014 but will need to learn the lessons of 2013 to win that elusive premiership.




mate who'll be missed next season.

Rockingham 3, played in Over 35 division 3 Woman Gold.


The team was comprised of a lot of talented players but had not played together as a team before. It was a



I would like to thank the parents and senior players who did assist with the games our juniors could not cover.


Rockingham Junior Carnival




