Big thank you to Neville Ford and Chris Pieri for helping me design our new fold down barrier fences. They look like costing us around \$27k and hopefully we will qualify for a grant. This fence will be an extension for training across field. The grandstand side will fold down, which means there will be no loss of viewing during games.

Congratulations to all teams that made the finals, in particular, those that made it into their grand finals, our Men's 1, Men's 4, Men's 5

and our Masters Ladies. The Mens 5 had the quinella, both Minor and Major Premiers.

Special thanks to our Head Coach, Matt Wells, who did a great job this season coaching both our Men's and Women's 1s. The continued consistency of our Men's 1 side, resulted in promotion from Premier 3 to Premier 2; our highest grade achieved. The new lineal grading system means the promotion is guaranteed (if we earn it), not like previous systems in Provisional 1 with a stacked grading playoff system, designed by the bigger clubs.

We must make sure we are represented at all HWA meetings in a couple of years, when the bigger clubs will try to reverse this trial grading system. At the same time, huge effort is needed by us to improve and make stronger our seconds teams.

I would like to remind members what our main objective of planning for the Divisions was; we must have a strong seconds team, which in turns makes a strong first team. (In both genders of our 2s teams, we did extremely well considering the lack of players.)

With the right advertising and members keen to take advantage of the higher Prem 2 grade, we could see a lot of new members next season.

It is a time that all members can help us invest in our future, by just offering to help occassionally or as much as you can.

I would like to thank all our very hard-working Board Members. Special thanks to the outgoing members, who did fantastic work in the job they volunteered to do. A lot of people do not appreciate the amount of time and effort all Board Members put in. We are losing great Board Members in Georgi, Rachel, David & Damien.

Thank you to all our Senior, Junior and Minkey/Grad Coaches and Team Managers. Thanks also to all members that performed duties around our facilities.

This was my 40th consecutive year with the club and I can say it had to be the hardest as far as administration goes. Once the boarders re-opened, COVID made our stretched numbers even lower. Lack of endeavour by members at training made the Boards efforts

ever so hard.

January to March, despite the Board Members frantically trying to get some involvement happening, no one was attending training, except the Men's top squad. No woman at all, other than mostly Juniors trying to make the first two teams and I think even that was about 12-15 girls training at the start of the season. The rest of the Men's sides were somewhere, but not at training. The Vets had more at training!

Our Juniors were similar with lack of numbers. We must double or treble our Junior numbers over the next season, then each year after.

We put into place a School Development Officer, John Wood, in 2019 with immediate results and this just started making ground for the start of 2020 when COVID hit and smashed it.

Recruitment, advertising and coaching Juniors is the most vital thing we need to do for the club over the coming years.

And we have the finances to make it happen.

Finance is only one part though; we still need people. This can only be done with a lot of hands helping. We have over 30 schools in this area. Possible candidates to help with our 'Schools Programme' would be anyone with spare time on weekdays, perhaps Uni students/FIFO's/shift workers?

Through David and Rachel, who have put in an enormous amount of work this year, we began a 'Junior Academy', run by our friend lan Healy (who is now Development Officer for HWA). This academy was possible only through the sponsorship from Agrishop and Cottage Engineering. We are hopeful that this academy will not only improve our Junior players skills, but give these playing selected players a new pathway into HWA Academies and possible State sides.

HWA were going to bring in a mandatory rule this season, but now it's supposed to begin in 2023. You may have noticed an increase in the numbers of clubs wearing an alternative strip. This is what the mandate will be; a requirement that all clubs have an alternative strip.

The Board has decided, and advised HWA, that we will run with the two strips we already have in place. **THE RED STRIP** (that our 1s currently wear) will now be our **MAIN STRIP** for the whole club. Our existing **BLACK STRIP** (that all other teams wear) will be our **ALTERNATIVE ONE**. Shorts and skirts remain the same.

One must note, that once mandated, no player will be allowed on the field if not in the correct strip, which also includes socks. If a player is not wearing the correct strip, and is protested against, they must leave the field.

The price to members for the new strips will be charged at cost; *in the vicinity* of \$30 for shirts and \$12 for the socks. It's suggested that

members may wish to also use their alternative strip/black strip for training. Any new players to the club will get a special price for the black strip.

We welcomed three new Life Members in 2022. Each are very long serving members and still very active within the club; Katherine Anson, Tom Hunter and

Simon Clifford won our Club Persons award, for his untiring volunteer work.






















J5/6 Boys 1
































Mens Prem 3


