



LIGHTS TECH TURF, ACTION


When the gates re-open for our Summer Series, we can't wait to introduce you to the new turf!










PRESIDENTS REPORT



COACHING DIRECTORS REPORT

Another season arrives and brings the challenge of unearthing the coaches required for each team.

It is always an interesting challenge that starts in October each year with the aim of finding a coach for each of our teams who has the time, knowledge, skills and commitment required, be it the establishment of base hockey skills for our younger Junior players, the development of our older Junior players for Senior hockey to the high-level refinement of our 1s teams to perform at the top level.

We entered the 2021 season with Matt Wells and Peter Ford coaching our Mens and Ladies 1s and committing to not only pushing their teams to win each week, but also to the common club goal of retaining and developing our talented Junior boys and girls for the future. The appointment of Ken Donovan and Damien Crick for coaching our Mens and Ladies 2s was critical, for these teams were considered our essential nursery for our recently graduated 11/12s and our current Juniors to grow and develop. Further to this, Matt Wells and Peter Ford spent time on skill development with all our Junior teams throughout the season, starting in April with the preseason coaching clinic and then a further three training sessions for each team, focusing on key areas identified by each team Coach.

Kaelee Parr returned to coach our Ladies 3/4s, again doing an excellent job with both teams making their grand finals, with the 3s taking out the flag. Many Juniors were also a part of these teams and attended training weekly. Kaelee was rewarded for this great work by being named the Senior Coach of the Year.

For the Mens 3/4/5s Brad Ball, Lee Cousins and Tim Manning all spent time each week making sure competitive teams were fielded. Sounds easy but trying to coordinate up to 40 players each week to be in the right place at the right time can be a little testing at times!

For the Junior teams we had more than the usual number of new Coaches to find for this season, with many of these new Coaches coming from within our Senior playing group.

Our 5/6s girls and boys teams continued to have great Coaches with Todd Ford and Dave Klinck dedicated to our younger players. This year we had a third 5/6 team that Matt Cox committed to coaching. The 7/8 boys John Wood was able to coach this season with Tash Keen-Smith coaching the girls for a second year, with some help from Rachel Ward.

Jade Vorenberg returned to coach her favourite team of 9/10 girls and for the boys Kym Jeffrey took on her first Junior coaching position of the club and did a great job with help from Brayden Buckwell. Kym was named Junior Coach of the Year with her team starting the season in B Grade, being promoted to A Prom grade early in the season and doing well enough to make the Semi-Finals in this grade.

For our 11/12s, Bayden Walker and Jesse Watt took on their first Junior coaching assignment with the boys and Donna McKeown and Chris Brown coached the girls, with many of these players also playing Senior hockey and training with the 1s or 2s teams.

I would like to thank all the Coaches for their commitment and time spent training, travelling at own expense, working on drills and game plans, etc that takes a lot more time than just the training and games we see them at. Without this, our Senior and Junior teams wouldn't perform as well as they do and our club would wither away. As members of the club, if you see any of these Coaches around, please take the time to thank them for what they do.

With season 2021 now officially over, we will take a quick break and the Board will meet in early October to start planning for 2022, and as always, our aim will be to strive to continually improve the hockey experience for our members.




















J7 8 A PROM GIRLS


































SENIOR DIRECTORS REPORT
